GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- Q.no. 1 to 3: Students are advised to solve these questions in a separate holiday homework copy and submit it on the school reopening day.
- Q.no. 4: It needs to be done in ¼th of a chart paper and student's name, class, section should be clearly mentioned in it.
- 1. Make a simple chart comparing trees in different seasons (summer, monsoon, winter). Illustrate and explain in 6 to 8 lines how trees are affected by the environment.
- 2. Plant a seed (beans, coriander etc.) and water it daily with a family member. Maintain a 7 day plant diary draw , label and describe changes you observe.
- 3. It's very important to spend some quality time with our family members. Keeping that in mind, cook an international dish together. Describe your experience in 80 to 100 words along with a picture.
- 4. Design and label a town map with buildings, people, places and landmarks. Write a short description of it. (70 to 80 words)
- Read a short news article about a local cleanliness drive.
 Question: Why is it important to keep our surroundings clean? Write two things you can do to help in your school or neighbourhood.

B. Try to solve:

- 3. What numbers can you make using 3, 5 and 7? You can make 357 and 537. What other...??
- 4. Read: 50 students are going on a picnic. Biscuits, oranges and bananas are distributed among them. Each child gets 1 orange, 1 banana and 5 biscuits. All the children take oranges and biscuits but 38 children do not take banana. Now give the answer How many oranges, biscuits and bananas are distributed?
- 5. Make a place-value chart with the periods. Each column must be of different colours.
